MONTANA Log Cabin History in Big Fork

In 1916, the same year Frank Lloyd Wright's son John Lloyd Wright introduced Lincoln Logs, Evans Cabin was built. Part of a log house community that would soon be anchored by Kootenai Lodge (a prime and newly restored example of rustic log architecture), the cabin is one of 10 recently updated historic homes for sale (along with 32 new residences done in the same style) and has numerous modern amenities, among them Sub-Zero appliances and a temperature-controlled wine room. \$5.9 million. *Call 406-837-3000*.





FLORIDA Elegant West Palm Beach Villa



Noted architect Addison
Mizner brought the Spanish Mission style from his native
California to Palm Beach in
1919 with a private hotel called
the Everglades Club. Since then

it has become the prevailing architectural aesthetic of the area. A four-bedroom, 4.5-bath West Palm Beach villa with Intracoastal Waterway views across Lake Worth to the Billionaire

Row section of Palm Beach Island continues this sensibility. Exceptional detailing defines the 5,391-square-foot house, which has yellow limestone and Brazilian cherrywood floors throughout.
